Considered one of the finest paraphrases written by Isaac Watts, "O God, Our Help in Ages Past" expresses a strong note of assurance, promise, and hope in the LORD as recorded in the first part of Psalm 90, even though the entire psalm has a recurring theme of lament. Watts wrote the paraphrase in nine stanzas around 1714 and first published the text in his *Psalms of David*. The *Psalter Hymnal* includes the most well-known stanzas. The first line, originally "Our God, our help...," was changed to "O God, our help... "by John Wesley in his *Collection of Psalms and Hymns*.


