Notice the progression of the text of this hymn, written by William How in 1864. The hymn begins with a proclamation of thanksgiving for the saints who confessed Christ and found in him protection and inspiration (st. 1-2). That proclamation is followed by a prayer for Christ's soldiers on earth to be "faithful, true, and bold" (st. 3). At the crux of the text is the confession of a the union of saints in heaven and on earth (st. 4). Though the holy warfare may be persist, "all the saints" may take courage from the vision of a victorious church that worships the triune God on that "more glorious day" at the return of Christ (st. 5-6).




