

"Walter C. Smith based this text on 1 Timothy 1: 17: 'Now to the King eternal, immortal, invisible, the only God, be honor and glory for ever and ever.' 'Immortal, Invisible' is a strong text of praise to God, who created and sustains the lives of all his creatures. The text focuses on the Creator of the universe, the invisible God whose visible works in nature testify to his glory and majesty. 'Light' is the prevailing image in stanzas 1, 2, and 4 (see also Ps. 104:2); our inability to see God is not because of insufficient light but because the 'splendor of light hides [God] from view.'

Walter Chalmbers Smith was educated at the University of Aberdeen and New College, Edinburgh, and became a Presbyterian pastor in the Free Church of Scotland in 1850. He served four congregations, including the Free High Church in Edinburgh (1876¬-1894). Moderator of his denomination in 1893, Smith was a man of wide interests. His poetry was published in some six volumes entitled *Poetical Works* (1902), and his hymn texts were published in *Hymns of Christ and the Christian Life* (1886).

This is a festival hymn of praise to God; for various other worship services, especially at the beginning of the service; with stanza 3 for services that focus on the brevity of life."

Do you, members of Grace Community Presbyterian Church, undertake the responsibility of assisting Jordan and Sara in the Christian nurture of Benjamin, do you?


