The exact origins of "God Rest Ye Merry Gentlemen" are somewhat shrouded in mystery, but it's believed to be one of the oldest Christmas carols, dating back to the 1500s or earlier. The carol likely originated in England and was originally sung by night watchmen as they patrolled the streets. The lyrics focus on the birth of Jesus Christ and the hope and joy it brings to humanity. The phrase "God rest you merry" is a traditional English blessing meaning "God grant you peace and happiness."


