Reflection: "Jesus notes, 'It is not what goes into the mouth that defiles a person, but what comes out of the mouth; this defiles a person' (v. 11). This had to be startling to Jesus' first hearers, since Mosaic law says it *is* possible to be defiled by touching an unclean person or eating unclean food (Leviticus 11). But the principle is true: accidents of touching or eating do not make humans unclean. Slanderous speech defiles lips more than eating the wrong food does."

anything that is his.


