This is one of John Newton's (1725-1807) most popular hymns. Verse 4 highlights the glorious twofold nature of Christ's cross: it demonstrates both God's mercy *and* His justice. Our lyrics about the cross are often lopsided, emphasizing only the greatness of God's love, while we neglect the truth that the cross is also a demonstration of God's terrifying judgment on sin. But the cross is worth wondering at because it is the place where God's love and wrath are reconciled. It is on the cross that "righteousness and peace have kissed each other" (Ps. 85:10). As Newton writes that "grace and justice join and point to mercy's store," he illustrates the truth that God is both *just* and the *justifier* of the one who has faith in Jesus (Rom. 3:26). These two truths are inseparable, so much so, that if we neglect the cross as a demonstration of God's love.




