


Helen Lemmel (1863-1961) was an accomplished American hymn writer, composer, and vocalist. Her midlife was marked by significant heartache and difficulty. While some accounts state she was already blind when she wrote the hymn, others indicate her blindness came later in life, and her husband tragically left her during a period of illness. Regardless, she knew profound personal suffering. The key inspiration for the hymn came in 1918. Helen Lemmel encountered a missionary tract or pamphlet written by Isabella Lilias Trotter (1853-1928). Lilias Trotter's pamphlet was titled "Focused: A Story and a Song." In it, she included a profound statement that deeply resonated with Helen Lemmel: *"So then, turn your eyes upon Him, look full into His face and you will find that the things of earth will acquire a strange new dimness."* Trotter's life itself was a living testament to this principle – she chose to focus completely on Christ and His mission, letting go of worldly recognition and comfort.

"Their being discouraged by their sins will cost them many a prayer, many a tear, and many a groan; and that because their discouragements under sin flow from ignorance and unbelief. It springs from their ignorance of the richness, freeness, fullness, and everlastingness of God's love; and from their ignorance of the power, glory, sufficiency, and efficacy of the death and sufferings of the Lord Jesus Christ; and from their ignorance of the worth, glory, fullness, largeness, and completeness of the righteousness of Jesus Christ; and from their ignorance of that real, close, spiritual, glorious, and inseparable union that is between Christ and their precious souls.
